The European Anti-Fraud Office (OLAF) investigates fraud against the Eu budget, corruption and serious misconduct within the European institutions, and develops anti- fraud policy for the Europea Commission. Europol supports the EU Member States in their fight against terrorism, cybercrime and other serious and organised forms of crime.

To achieve its objectives, the EPPO will need to establish effective cooperation with its key partners.
